

Assistant Dean for Clinical Education

The University of Florida, College of Pharmacy, is seeking a visionary leader for the position of **Assistant Dean for Clinical Education**

The Assistant Dean for Clinical Education will lead the Office of Experiential Programs in developing an innovative experiential curriculum that is recognized nationally as an exemplar. This individual will also play a prominent role in oversight of the quality of experiential programs and be accountable for matters related to experiential education. This individual is supported by the Director of Experiential Programs, regional faculty coordinators and staff members who are responsible for daily operations of the experiential programs. These individuals are responsible for needs of students across the Gainesville, Jacksonville, and Orlando campuses. The Assistant Dean for Clinical Education will report to the Associate Dean for Professional Education and the Associate Dean for Clinical Affairs.

Leadership Responsibilities

The Assistant Dean for Clinical Education will provide leadership for clinical education services including, but not limited to: development of innovative approaches in experiential education, oversight and mentoring for the Director of Experiential Programs, review of outcomes data from experiential programs and refinement of the clinical curriculum to address identified needs, enhancement of the continuous quality improvement program for experiential learning, compliance with accreditation standards related to clinical education, and oversight of the pre-and post-residency placement activities. A close working relationship with the Office of Curricular Affairs and the Office of Student Affairs is essential.

The Assistant Dean for Clinical Education will serve on the Curriculum Committee and the Academic and Professional Standards Committee.

Appointment and Qualifications

The position is a full-time tenure/non-tenure-level appointment at the minimum rank of Associate or Clinical Associate Professor.

Minimum Qualifications

1. Pharm.D. or Ph.D. degree
2. Accomplishments in teaching, research, and service appropriate for appointment as an Associate or Full Professor
3. Commitment to a culture of diversity and inclusion
4. An innovative mindset with respect to experiential education.
5. Comprehensive knowledge of approaches and issues in pharmacy education
6. Excellent verbal and written communication skills
7. Ability to work collaboratively in a team environment
8. Experience in establishing and maintaining rapport with faculty, staff, and students

Preferred Qualifications

1. Prior involvement in experiential programs or experience as faculty on clinical education or experiential-related committees

2. Experience in developing innovative educational approaches.
3. Knowledge of the 2016 ACPE Accreditation Standards related to experiential programs

About the College

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The University of Florida



The University of Florida is an American public land-grant, sea-grant, and space-grant research university located on a 2,000-acre campus in Gainesville, Florida. The university traces its historical origins to 1853, and has operated continuously on its present Gainesville campus since September 1906. The University of Florida is ranked 14th overall among all public national universities in the current 2017 U.S. News & World Report rankings, and consistently ranks within the top 100 universities worldwide. It is considered a "Public Ivy," a designation reserved for the top public universities in the United States. Since 1985, UF has been a member of the Association of American Universities, the higher-education organization comprising the top 62 public and private institutions in North America. It is one of three "research flagship universities" within the State University System of Florida, as designated by the Florida Legislature.

UF has nearly 5,000 faculty members with distinguished records in teaching, research and service, including over 37 Eminent Scholar chairs and 43 faculty elections to the National Academy of Sciences, Engineering, the Institute of Medicine, or the American Academy of Arts and Sciences. It is the seventh largest single-campus university in the United States with almost 50,000 students enrolled. The University of Florida is home to sixteen academic colleges and more than 150 research centers and institutes. It offers multiple graduate professional programs, 123 master's degree programs and 76 doctoral degree programs in 87 schools and departments. As of fall 2011, Florida ranked fourteenth among all institutions in the number of new National Merit Scholars enrolled.

The University of Florida received a record \$724 million in research awards last fiscal year. UF ranked eighth among universities in the number of U.S. patents issued in 2011 and in the number of start-up companies created in 2011. UF was tied for 13th in the number of invention disclosures in 2011. UF's Clinical and Translational Science Institute is one of only 60 that the National Institutes of Health is funding to speed the transformation of scientific discoveries into medical advances for patients. UF's Institute on Aging is home to one of only 10 Claude D. Pepper Older Americans Independence Centers nationally and the leader of a \$60 million study to determine whether physical activity can help older adults remain mobile.



University of Florida Health Science Center

The University of Florida Health Science Center (HSC) celebrated its 50th year in 2006. It is one of the country's few academic health centers with six health-related colleges located on a single, contiguous campus. The colleges, including Colleges of Dentistry, Medicine, Nursing, Pharmacy, Public Health and Health Professions, and Veterinary Medicine, teach the full continuum of higher education, enrolling more than 6,900 students and 1,100 interns and residents each year. With more than \$420 million in grant funding to support ongoing research, UF Health physicians and faculty are advancing new discoveries to impact health care locally, nationally and around the world.

In addition to the six colleges, there are nine major health-related research centers and institutes (Cancer Center, Clinical and Translational Science Institute, Diabetes Institute, Institute on Aging, , Emerging Pathogens Institute, McKnight Brain Institute, Institute for Child Health Policy, the UF Research and Academic Center at Lake Nona and the Genetics Institute) designed to create synergistic and collaborative research opportunities.



The HSC is closely affiliated with UF Health, part of the University of Florida Health System, with seven hospitals including two academic medical centers in Gainesville and Jacksonville, a children's hospital, three community hospitals, two specialty hospitals, and more than 80 outpatient primary and specialty care practices across North Florida, all linked through a fully integrated electronic health record system.

UFHealth is the state's leading healthcare referral system and one of the Southeast's most respected healthcare providers with close to 80,000 hospital admissions, 155,000 emergency room visits and 930,000 outpatient visits annually. More than 1,500 UF faculty and community physicians representing more than 100 medical specialties work provide patient care not only within Shands HealthCare but also at the Veterans Affairs Medical Center located right across the UFHealth campus.

UF College of Pharmacy



The University of Florida College of Pharmacy was established in 1923 and is the oldest of six health science colleges at UF. Consistently ranked by U.S. News and World Report as the top pharmacy college in Florida and number 9 nationally, the college prides itself on training the next generation of pharmacists through its masters, Pharm.D., and Ph.D. programs. Faculty in the college are annually recognized among the elite educators in the country with recent awards from organizations such as the Institute of Medicine, the American College of Clinical Pharmacy and the American Association of Pharmaceutical Scientists.

The Pharm.D. program annually enrolls 270 students across the college's three campuses in Gainesville, Jacksonville and Orlando. Each campus features the same Pharm.D. curriculum. Through its new team-based and

interprofessional Pharm.D. curriculum introduced in 2015, the college is preparing students to be 21st century pharmacists ready to provide patient-centered care. The curriculum emphasizes personal and professional development that are key to students being highly effective clinicians.

Research activities in the college span a broad range of interests and generated \$14.8 million in extramural funding in 2016, ranking UF in the top 10 nationally by the American Association of Colleges of Pharmacy in total grant funding. The college has three research centers: The Center for Pharmacogenomics, the Center for Drug Discovery, and the Center for Pharmacometrics and Systems Pharmacology. The most recent initiative to advance the research and graduate missions is the establishment of the interdisciplinary Institute of Therapeutic Innovation for Pharmacometrics and Systems Pharmacology at the Lake Nona campus, which focuses on regulatory sciences, drug-modeling simulation, and translational science. The college is recognized internationally for its scientific contributions in the areas of pharmacogenomics, pharmacometrics, pharmaceutical outcomes and policy, and drug design and discovery research.

The college has extensive affiliations, partnerships and collaborations to support practice excellence. A key contributor to UF Health, the Southeast's most comprehensive health system and the nation's only academic health center with six health-related colleges located on a single, continuous campus, the college offers a wealth of interdisciplinary educational, research and clinical partnerships. The close relationship with UF Health has forged successful development of interprofessional educational and innovative advanced pharmacy practice experiences, strong involvement in the Clinical and Translational Science Institute, other interdisciplinary research, and service that has improved patient safety. In addition to active practice sites maintained by clinical practice faculty, two Medication Management Centers have been established in Gainesville and Orlando. To meet the continuing professional development of pharmacy practitioners, the college has five pharmacy residency programs and five clinical fellowship programs.

Community

Gainesville, Florida has a population of over 125,000, with the surrounding population of Alachua County exceeding 250,000. Gainesville is an easy drive to Florida's beaches on coasts, as well as Orlando, Tampa, St. Petersburg and Jacksonville. Gainesville has been ranked as a top place to live and boasts a vibrant arts and cultural community that includes the Florida Museum of Natural History, Harn Museum of Art and the Curtis M. Phillips Center for the Performing Arts. The climate is mild, with more than 2,800 hours of sunshine annually and average temperatures of 65 degrees in January and 89 degrees in June. The local economy derives from agriculture to manufacturing and the University, Shands and the VA are the leading employers in the region. The presence of UF has led to numerous start-up companies in the community, and the recent creation of the Florida Development Hub and Innovation Square. While cost of living are low, Gainesville offers an excellent public school system.
