POSITION SUMMARY

Oversee implementation of survey and formative assessment data collection across survey sites to ensure data collection activities are implemented according to standard operating procedures.

MAJOR ACCOUNTABILITIES

- Support training of survey staff, including training on good clinical practices, survey procedures, data management and confidentiality
- Conduct supervision and monitoring visits to all survey sites; review study-related materials and procedures during visits; ensure compliance with study protocols and SOPs; identify issues arising during data collection and support Site Coordinators to address/resolve issues
- Maintain daily communication with Site Coordinators through WhatsApp, calls, and monitoring visits regarding data collection progress; submit weekly reports regarding data collection and other survey activities
- Coordinate closely with the BBS Project Director and investigators by participating in regular (weekly/bi-weekly) calls to communicate progress in recruitment, enrolment, and completion of linkage to care for eligible survey participants
- Ensure all adverse events are properly documented and reported to the BBS Project Director according to protocol
- Coordinate with sites to ensure all study participants in need of linkage to care or psychosocial support services are linked to appropriate stakeholders
- Investigate data discrepancies and data quality issues with Site Coordinators, as needed
